An environmental paint solution for this historic winery that established a new Café in 2005.

We used a heat reflective external coating on the café's roof that is sustainable and endures Australia's harsh climate.

This heat reflective product significantly reduces internal temperatures and has impacted on cost savings on energy bills.

Description:

This project was referred by Architects specialising in sustainable painting. Energy Star heat reflective paint was applied to the corrugated iron roof of the café to reduce internal temperatures during hot summer days, for this 150 seat Café built in 2005.

In summer the kitchen/preparation area of the Café was extremely hot and at times the air-conditioning system had to be turned on the day prior to a hot day being forecasted.

The brief required a neutral look that was in keeping with the rustic appeal of the café that was sympathetic to the natural landscape and surrounds.

Specifications: Energy Star Heat Reflective Paint/Neutral tones.
